Galaxy Commercial Holding Brings Luxury Apartments to Beverly Hills

MAY 09, 2007 -- Beverly Hills, Calif. -- Galaxy Commercial Holding LLC, a real estate development company located in Beverly Hills, Calif., is building Blü, a modern, luxury apartment community also in Beverly Hills.

Gensler, a leading global design, planning and strategic consulting firm designed Blü, located at 8601 Wilshire Blvd. The complex broke ground in July 2005 and is scheduled for completion in summer 2007, Heather Koopman, project spokesperson, tells MHN.

The 11-story building will include 37 apartments, with a maximum of five units per floor. One- and two-bedroom residences' rents will range from \$4,000 to \$7,000 and they will range in size from 900 to 1,300 square feet, offering sprawling views of Beverly Hills and Hollywood from large floor-to-ceiling windows.

Each residence will be pre-wired for digital cable, multiple phone lines and high-speed Internet access. Each residence features CaesarStone countertops, stainless steel appliances, Kohler tubs and fixtures and in-unit washer and dryer. The contemporary exterior will be constructed with blue glass, complemented by a ground-floor retail tenant, not yet announced.

Additional amenities include full-service concierge; doorman; fitness center with Precor, Life Fitness and Cybex equipment; media room with a coffee bar, plasma TV, WiFi connectivity and conference call capabilities; and the enviable rooftop terrace lounge.

Blü is located within five blocks east of shopping on Robertson Boulevard, two blocks west of Restaurant Row on La Cienega, and minutes away from Rodeo Drive and Beverly Center.
